History of the MARIN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Early Tennis Competitions

The Mill Valley Tennis Club was founded in 1929. In February 1930, MVTC hosted an exhibition match featuring four nationally ranked players: Gerald Stratford, Cranston Holman, Phil Neer and Howard Kinsey. More than 200 spectators enjoyed a caliber of tennis never before seen in Marin County.



That same year, the fledgling Club entered a team in the annual inter-club competition among the top Bay Area tennis clubs. A few local "ringers" were recruited to supplement the members on the team roster, and this group went on to defeat all comers, including the Berkeley Tennis Club and the California Club in the finals. The team members included Dr. Weiss, Jack Cosgrove, Elmer Sewell, Ted Lindner, Elmer

Gaetjen, Fred Haas and Wilmer Trainer. The Club repeated as winner of this Northern California Inter-Club event again the following year.

This success spurred Club members to initiate an open invitational tournament, dubbed the Marin County Tennis Championships, in May 1930. Despite only four courts, no clubhouse and only a small dressing room building, the tournament was a huge success, largely because of

aenerous hospitality of the the members, outstanding weather, food stands temporarily installed and the high quality of tennis among the competitors. Robert Sellers, the reigning Pacific Coast champion, defeated Gerald Stratford in the men's singles final in a hard-fought, five-set (!) match.



The final night of the tournament saw a spontaneous demand for a celebration. With only a few hours notice, the Outdoor Art Club was rented, and enthusiastic members scoured the county to secure large quantities of spaghetti, French bread and illegal (Prohibition era) wine. The party was a huge success, and marked the beginning of the annual "Spaghetti Festival," a very popular Club event for more than 25 years.

A Rich Tournament Tradition

From this early beginning, and for more than 90 years, Mill Valley Tennis



Club has hosted some of the premier tennis tournaments in northern California. Exhibition matches and tournaments during the 1930s featured Don Budge, Helen Wills Moody, Alice Marble, Margaret Osborne, Frank Kovacs, Virginia Wolfenden, and Patricia Canning. During the 1930s through the early 1960s, the Marin County Tennis Championships were a fixture at MVTC, regularly attracting the

best open players from across the Bay Area.

In the early 1960s, through the efforts of Howard Morehouse, the National Men's 35s Championships came to MVTC, where they remained until 1977. This prestigious tournament attracted nationally ranked players from around the country. Local tennis promoter, and former pro Barry McKay won the National Men's 35s twice in the early 1970s. Tom Brown, Whitney Reed, Clifford Mayne, Hugh Ditzler and Don Kierbow were among the many other nationally ranked winners in this tournament.



In 1977, Bob Seymour helped the Club initiate the Marin Seniors Tournament, now an annual event at MVTC. This tournament, featuring ranked players from across the country, has been rated by the USTA since the early 2000s as a Category II National Tournament, just one notch below the national championship level.

From 2000-2004, MVTC hosted an Open Invitational Tournament as a



successor to the long-running open invitational at the Golden Gateway Tennis Center in San Francisco – a tournament MVTC Pro Polo Cowan had won each of the prior three years. This exhibition-style event brought some of the top area open players to Mill Valley, to compete before an appreciative crowd on Friday evenings as a prelude to summer cocktails and BBQs.

More Recent Years

The popularity and prestige of the Marin Seniors Tournament has continued to grow. In recent years, over 250 players per year from all over the country -- including New York, Florida, Texas, Missouri, Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, and Oregon -- have competed in this annual event. Competition includes men's, women's, singles, doubles, and mixed in age groups ranging from 30s to 85s. Prize money

is approximately \$25,000. The name of the tournament was changed from Marin Seniors to Marin Championships in 2014 in recognition of its larger scale and wider scope.



This tournament has been named the NorCal Senior Tournament of the Year several times, including three of the past six years, in recognition of both the quality of play and the quality of the event. Credit for this, in true MVTC tradition, goes to the large number of member volunteers who devote considerable time and effort to making this event so special.

Tournament chairs have included Bob Seymour, Dick Dresel, Marilyn Stevens, Jani Ross, Susan McShannock, Chrissie Costamagna and Susan Tighe.
